## Points of Interest

? The fall graduating class of 1996 consisted of 331 graduates, 261 were bachelors, 68 were masters, and 2 were doctorates.
? Of the 331 graduates, 298 were from Texas, 8 were from other states, and 25 were from other countries when they entered the University. Now only two list out of state and seventeen list other counties as permanent addresses.
? The most frequent county of origin of graduates was Kleberg (57), followed by Nueces (55), Jim Wells (36), Cameron (23), and Bexar county (17).
? Two hundred and five ( $62 \%$ ) of the graduates were minority students. One hundred and eighty (69\%) of the bachelors, twenty four (35\%) of the masters, and $1(50 \%)$ of the doctorates were minority students.
? One hundred and eighty (54\%) of the graduates were female. One hundred and fifty ( $57 \%$ ) of the bachelors, twenty eight ( $41 \%$ ) of the masters, and all of the doctorates were female.
? Of the 261 bachelors graduates, $158(61 \%)$ entered the University as first time freshmen and 103 (39\%) entered as transfer students. Of the 158 first time freshmen, 73 (46\%) took at least one remediation course.
? Average age of bachelors was 26.8 years (min 21, max 54)
? Average age of masters was 34.6 years ( $\min 22$, max 65)
? Average age of doctorates was 42.6 years ( $\min 35$, max 49)
