



Recommended Immunizations for Adults & College Students

Texas A&M does not require proof of immunizations to attend classes. College students who have graduated high school in Texas should be up to date on childhood immunizations. Many insurances pay for immunizations through your own physician or practitioner (The LSW Health Care Services clinic does not accept insurance at this time). Additional recommended immunizations for college students, not usually given to high school students, are:

HPV: “Gardasil” for women 26 years old or less. This is a series of three vaccinations and is not available at the LSW.

Influenza: Given by the LSW clinic and by the Dept. of State Health Services on campus every fall. Cost: up to \$15 and may be free.

Meningitis: May be ordered by LSW if student demand necessitates. Cost: about \$100.

Tuberculosis testing: Students and staff involved in health care, teaching and other fields may be required to get TB tests. Cost: \$6. In general, high-risk groups that should be tested for infection include:

Close contacts of persons known or suspected to have TB (i.e., those sharing the same household or other enclosed environments)

Foreign-born persons, including children, from areas that have a high TB incidence or prevalence (e.g., Asia, Africa, Latin America, Eastern Europe)

Residents and employees of high-risk congregate settings (e.g., correctional institutions, nursing homes, long-term residential facilities, and shelters for the homeless)

Health care workers who serve high-risk clients

Some medically underserved, low-income populations as defined locally

High-risk racial or ethnic minority populations, defined locally as having an increased prevalence of TB (e.g., Asians and Pacific Islanders, Hispanics, African Americans, Native Americans, migrant farm workers, or homeless persons)

Persons who inject illicit drugs; any other locally identified high-risk substance users (e.g., crack cocaine users)
