- * The names of visitors will not be entered on the class rolls or permanent records.

NOTE: A classroom visitor is not to be confused with a student who continues in a course after dropping it for credit. A student who has been registered for credit and then has dropped with a grade of "Q" may continue in the class on a non-graded basis, retaining all privileges of other registered students.
