#### **FACULTY TRAVEL FUNDING AWARDED**



The college has finalized faculty travel awards for the February 2022 award cycle. A total of 16 faculty were awarded funding totaling \$13,697.

Mark your calendar...the final round of faculty travel support funding for the academic year will be April 7-8, 2022.



- Open Educational Resources (OĒR) - Arts & Sciences seeks proposals from faculty to develop, modify, or adopt OER for implementation in AY 2022–2023. COAS will select up to five proposals for developing new OER and up to five for adopting and/or modifying existing materials. Awardees will receive 2022 summer pay up to \$3,000 (for new) or up to \$1,000 (for existing). The submission deadline is February 15, 2022.
- Spring 2022 Research Support -Arts & Sciences is pleased to announce funding availability for Faculty Research Support. Proposals are currently being accepted for faculty support to write research proposals with the potential to secure external funding, or for research that will result in significant future publications. Faculty Award period: March 1, 2022 – July 31, 2022. Faculty may request support up to \$6,000.00. Proposals must be received by 5p.m. on Tuesday, February 15,

The College of Arts & Sciences issued a call for proposals, allowing faculty the opportunity to apply for funding to support a student assistantship for the spring 2022 semester.


The college is pleased to announce student assistantships were awarded to 20 faculty members across the college, resulting in \$30,000 in funding to support student employment and hands on learning.

Two ensembles from the School of Music have been selected to perform at the Texas Music Educators Association conference in San Antonio, Texas this February.



# ANNUAL FACULTY EVALUATION PROCESS OPENS

The online annual evaluation process has opened for faculty members to submit completed E-Portofolios to Blackboard. All full-time faculty (tenured, tenure-track, professors of practice and lecturers) in the College of Arts & Sciences will be required to submit an E-Portfolio in Blackboard for the 2021 calendar year.

The Office of the Dean has prepared a resource guide to help faculty navigate the process. It is available on the college website: www.tamuk.edu/artsci/about-COAS/fsresources.html

#### **Reminders & Recommendations**

- Allow plenty of time to prepare the portfolio, as the submission deadline and subsequent review schedule are strictly followed.
- Do not omit any required sections or combine elements that should remain separate.
- It is recommended that faculty align their Narrative with their department's scoring tables (i.e. list activities in the order they appear on the document the chair uses to assign points). This helps ensure all activities receive credit and are located in the correct category.



# ANNUAL FACULTY EVALUATION DEADLINES

As the process routes through Blackboard, there are no exceptions to the established deadlines.

#### March 10, 2022

Last day for faculty members to submit completed E-Portfolio to Blackboard course.

#### March 11, 2022

Blackboard course opens for Department Chair review.

#### **April 8, 2022**

Last day for Department Chairs to post evaluation to the Blackboard course. Chair will conduct meeting with faculty and provide copy of evaluation document outside of Blackboard.

#### **April 11, 2022**

Blackboard course opens for Dean review.

#### May 13, 2022

Last day for Dean to post evaluation report to Blackboard course. Dean's office will provide copy of evaluation to faculty outside of Blackboard.
