Two New Faculty Members Join the Geosciences Program

Sharing Field Camp Experiences from Four Majors



Jessica Garcia and Adam Pasciak attended the Western Michigan University field camp. Their program provides Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) training, groundwater geophysics, well drilling and installation, aquifer testing, groundwater sampling and monitoring, and remedial well-field design. Jonathon Boehm attended the Illinois State University Geology Field camp. Their field camp accomplished field exercises in the Big Horn Mountains, Yellowstone National Park, and the Black Hills in Wyoming.

Lily Alfaro attended the Idaho State University field camp (Lost River Field Station) located directly in front of the Borah Peak. She studied Proterozoic and Paleozoic sedimentary rocks, Cretaceous granitic intrusions, Eocene plutonic and volcanic rocks, Neogene-Quaternary Snake River Plain bimodal volcanic rocks and active faults. She also studied a cross section of the Cordilleran fold and thrust belt, from the frontal folds and thrusts to the Pioneer Mountains metamorphic core complex and Idaho batholith. Other studies of Quaternary geology included circues and till, basalt flows at Craters of the Moon National Monument, and the 1983 Borah Peak fault scarp.
