
## Master of Music

The Texas A&M University-Kingsville School of Music offers Master of Music degrees in Performance, Conducting, and Education in an environment that provides a high-quality graduate education at an exceptionally affordable cost.

The 36-credit hour graduate programs in Conducting or Performance are taught in a traditional, two-year, long-semester format and require an audition. Both programs feature 12 hours of core music classes and 24 hours of specialization courses in the student's area of concentration that culminates in a graduate recital in either performance or conducting, depending on the chosen program. The 36-credit hour program in Music Education is taught during summer terms and includes a course-only or research project with 18 credits in specializations of elementary and secondary education. .

### Concert Bands

The nationally-recognized TAMUK band program offers a wide variety of performance opportunities for nearly 300 talented musicians from across the university. Encompassing four distinct ensembles – Wind Symphony, Symphonic Band, Concert Band and University Band – our ensembles perform over 20 major concerts each academic year and feature a wide variety of repertoire. From traditional masterworks to exciting world premieres, and from virtuosic concertos to chamber winds, our bands provide students the opportunity to explore music at the very highest level, collaborate with guest composers and soloists, and develop ensemble skills in preparation for careers in performance and music education. Placement in TAMUK Bands is determined by audition and open to students from all majors. Ensemble scholarships are available.

### The Pride of South Texas Javelina Marching Band

For many decades, the Javelina Marching Band (JMB) has truly served as the Pride of South Texas, performing countless times at football games, exhibitions, parades, festivals and other major events. Praised for its big sound, exciting visuals, and longstanding tradition, the band is the largest student organization on campus and performs for the largest audiences of any ensemble in the region. As an educational organization, the JMB provides a wealth of leadership, teaching, and organizational opportunities for future music educators, as well as a fantastic musical and social outlet for students of all majors. ## CHORAL and VOCAL STUDIES

### Our Program

The Choral and Vocal Studies program at Texas A&M University-Kingsville offers students opportunities to engage in the highest level of voice training while working to meet their educational and professional goals. Our small classes, taught by dedicated and skilled faculty, are designed to provide individualized attention in subject matter ranging from music theory and history, to opera and musical theatre, to choral performance and conducting.

Our students' talents are continually recognized throughout South Texas and across the country. Many have competed or performed regionally, statewide, and nationally with such organizations as the Texas Choral Directors Association, the American Choral Directors Association, the National Association of Teachers of Singing, and the National Opera Association. Graduates from our program serve as choir directors, voice teachers, elementary music teachers, and performers across Texas and throughout the nation. Many pursue graduate-level study at schools such as the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music, the University of Texas, Boston Conservatory, and the Cleveland Institute of Music.

## Ensembles and Performance Opportunities

### Concert Choir

Texas A&M University-Kingsville's Concert Choir is the largest choral ensemble in the School of Music. Open to all university students, the Concert Choir performs a variety of works ranging from Renaissance to the 21st century. Performances of large masterworks have included Johannes Brahms *Requiem* and Franz Joseph Haydn's *Lord Nelson Mass*. The Concert Choir collaborates with the Corpus Christi Symphony Orchestra in performances of holiday concerts and in such works as Ludwig van Beethoven's *Symphony #9* and Carl Orff's *Carmina Burana*.

### Opera Workshop/Musical Theatre

The Opera Workshop and Musical Theatre ensembles provide multiple opportunities each year for students to perform in fully staged opera and musical theatre productions and scenes programs. Students gain experience in performance as well as stage production. Previous productions include Andrew Lippa's *The Addams Family*, Gilbert and Sullivan's *Princess Ida*, and W. A. Mozart's *Magic Flute*.

### Chamber Singers

Chamber Singers is an auditioned ensemble primarily dedicated to performing unaccompanied choral music. The ensemble performs a variety of literature from vocal jazz to popular arrangements to a cappella choral music. Past performances have included such works as Eric Whitacre's *Water Night*, Claude Debussy's *Trois Chansons de Charles d'Orléans* and Morten Lauridsen's *O magnum mysterium*.

### Mariachi Javelina

Vocal students, along with all TAMUK students, can join Mariachi Javelina. Focusing on the study of mariachi music through traditional instruments and vocal performance, this ensemble performs at numerous venues, special events, and competitions throughout Texas.

## Jazz Ensembles

### ■ Jazz Bands I, II, & III

The jazz bands offer students the chance to perform a diverse range of big band jazz literature, spanning from the early 20th century to the present. Participants are among the most accomplished jazz musicians at the university, bringing a wealth of talent to each ensemble.

 *Jazz Band I is one of the most accomplished ensembles at TAMUK. In addition to their many awards, they regularly perform at various jazz festivals and competitions nationwide, including an annual appearance at the Texas Jazz Festival in Corpus Christi.*

### ■ Jazz Combos

The jazz combos focus on standard and contemporary jazz literature, including many student-composed originals and arrangements. This program emphasizes creativity through the study and practice of jazz improvisation, encouraging students to develop their unique musical voices.

 *The Jazz Combos have also been recognized including their own selection to perform at TMEA. They have released three albums since 2022 all which feature original compositions by TAMUK students and faculty and all recorded in the state-of-the-art recording studio in the Music Education Complex.*

### ■ Latin Jazz Ensemble

The Latin Jazz Ensemble introduces students to the music and performance practices of various styles of Latin jazz. Students explore different Latin idioms and forms, learning to distinguish between them and develop characteristic stylistic interpretations of the music.

## Performance Opportunities

### ■ Annual Jazz Festival

The TAMUK Jazz Festival, now in its 57th year, is a two-day event that features jazz band competitions and clinics for high school and middle school students, along with evening concerts showcasing TAMUK jazz bands and combos. Typically held on the last weekend of March, the festival attracts world-renowned jazz artists who present and perform each year.

### ■ Jazz Bash and Jazz Blast

These annual events mark the end of each semester and provide additional performance opportunities for TAMUK jazz ensembles. The **Jazz Bash** takes place on the Monday and Tuesday evening before Thanksgiving in our beautiful performance hall within the School of Music. The **Jazz Blast** is held near the end of April in an outdoor, relaxed setting.

## SOUND RECORDING TECHNOLOGY

### Our Program

The School of Music at Texas A&M University-Kingsville offers students the opportunity to pursue studies in the field of audio production while maintaining a balanced approach to musical studies. The BM in SRT provides the aspiring entrepreneurial musician with the skills and tools needed to succeed in the rapidly-changing field of audio production. From recording classical, jazz, and commercial production to creating audio for multimedia and stage, the SRT program challenges students to be accomplished audio engineers, producers, and musicians.

Some of the best audio engineers and producers are experienced musicians. By offering a Bachelor of Music in Sound Recording Technology (SRT), the School of Music at Texas A&M Kingsville offers South Texas students a unique opportunity to pursue studies in audio production while maintaining a balanced approach to their musical studies. The BM in SRT provides aspiring entrepreneurial musicians with the skills and tools needed to succeed in the rapidly changing field of audio production.

Unique to the SRT program at Kingsville, beginning in the third year, applied lessons switch from instrumental or vocal studies to audio production. These individual lessons are tailored to each student's interests, allowing for a custom degree tailored to each student's interests and facilitating study beyond the core SRT courses.

From recording classical, jazz, and commercial productions to creating audio for multimedia and stage, the SRT program challenges students to be audio engineers, producers, and accomplished musicians.



## ■ Recording Facilities

The recording studio at Texas A&M-Kingsville features a large live room, two isolation booths, a control room, and a post-production room. Additionally, the music building uses "audio over IP" to connect the performance spaces and rehearsal halls, effectively making the entire building part of the studio. This industry-standard technology allows multiple students to record several sessions simultaneously. With over 160 School of Music events held annually, students have numerous opportunities for practical experience in recording, mixing audio for live sound, and streaming.

## ■ Certificate Option

In addition to the Bachelor of Music in Sound Recording Technology, Texas A&M-Kingsville offers the SRT Certificate Program. This certificate program is open to any University major, allowing students to pursue audio production while continuing with other degree opportunities. Students begin by studying the fundamentals of audio production and music entrepreneurship, then branch into an area of interest such as live sound, multimedia, or studio recording.

## Audition Requirements

1 Complete the application process for music majors and audition on your principal instrument or voice.

2 Write a brief essay (1-2 pages) discussing why you are interested in pursuing sound recording technology. Topics may include but are not limited to your musical and/or production experience, your current production setup, and career goals or aspirations. Essay should be submitted in either Word or PDF format.

3 Submit a short (60-90 second) video introducing yourself and explaining your strengths and why this degree is suited for you. This is your elevator pitch, not only convince us you belong here, but that it is to our advantage to have you in the program. Video may be submitted as an MPEG4, YouTube link, or Vimeo.

### Optional

**Digital Production Portfolio.** Items can include recording sessions, mix sessions, song writing examples, or video productions with audio. Please include a link to your materials if you wish to include it in the application process.

### Our Program

The **Latin American Music Studies** area is a new focus at Texas A&M University-Kingsville building on the tradition of one of the first collegiate mariachi groups in the nation. This provides a new opportunity for both music and non-music students to pursue their passions with the mariachi minor as they cultivate a deeper understanding through coursework, lessons, and teaching experience so they can succeed as educators.

## Mariachi Pedagogy Minor

The Mariachi Pedagogy minor is intended for students who desire more instruction in all elements of mariachi music, performance, and pedagogy. Within Texas public school secondary education, a growing number of programs are seeking musicians qualified to lead and grow mariachi programs. Until now, students from Texas A&M University-Kingsville have only had experience performing in college mariachi before they are asked to teach mariachi in public schools. The Mariachi Pedagogy minor will provide students with a foundation in mariachi in order to teach several aspects of the genre: performance, history, beginning methods, and pedagogy. For non-music majors, this minor offers an opportunity to become more knowledgeable and more proficient performers in mariachi.

## Mariachi Javelina

Since the early 1970s, Mariachi Javelina has represented Texas A&M University-Kingsville as the premiere mariachi ensemble. Once formed by Juan Ortiz, the ensemble continues its illustrious tradition through some of the university's finest musicians. Mariachi Javelina requires an audition and is open to all students of all majors. The Mariachi Javelina program has been a part of the regular collegiate curriculum since its inception and was the first established collegiate mariachi in the state of Texas. In addition to its Fall and Spring recitals, Mariachi Javelina routinely performs at special events, tours, and travels for national competitions. Some of Mariachi Javelina's most memorable experiences were opening concerts for Mariachi Sol de México de Jose Hernández and Mariachi Campanas de America as well as placing 2nd in the collegiate category at the Mariachi Vargas Extravaganza in 2018 and an invitational performance to the Texas Music Educators Association Convention in 2019.



## PERCUSSION STUDIES

### Our Program

Percussion Studies at Texas A&M University-Kingsville encompass all areas of percussion including snare drum, keyboard, timpani, accessory percussion, drumset, world percussion, and the marching arts. Each member of the studio takes a weekly private lesson that hones their technical and musical ability. Joining Dr. Tomlinson is Lecturer of Percussion, Cristian Zavala, and Adjunct Professor of Jazz Drumset, Steve Picataggio.

Our extensive percussion inventory includes 10 5.0 marimbas, three sets of Yamaha balanced action timpani, and a full collection of xylophones, glockenspiels, chimes, bass drums, snare drums, toms, and accessory instruments.


## PIANO STUDIES

### ■ Kingsville Symphony Orchestra

The Kingsville Symphony Orchestra is an outstanding regional training orchestra bringing together students of the Texas A&M University-Kingsville School of Music and professional musicians from orchestras throughout the South Texas and Rio Grande Valley regions. Professional musicians serve as mentors to student members of the KSO. Mentor musicians who play in the KSO are musicians from the Corpus Christi Symphony, the Victoria Symphony, the San Antonio Symphony, and the Austin Symphony. The Kingsville Symphony Orchestra performs four concerts per academic year focusing on standard orchestral works from the Renaissance to the 21st century including works such as: Tchaikovsky's Fourth Symphony, Gustav Holst's *The Planets*, Quinn Mason's *Inspiration! Festive Overture*, Jean Sibelius's *Finlandia*, Cladue Debussy's *Petite Suite*, Antonin Dvorak's *Carnival Overture*, Ferde Grofé's *Grand Canyon Suite*, John Corigliano's Oboe Concerto, Florence Price's *Dances in the Canebrakes*, Takashi Yoshimatsu's *Cyberbird Concerto for Saxophone and Orchestra*, George Whitefield Chadwick's *Symphonic Sketches* and may more. The TAMUK School of Music Instrumental and Vocal Solo Competition is held annually each January and winners solo with the KSO Chamber Orchestra and Wind Symphony in the spring semester.

### ■ Carnegie Hall Link Up Program

The Kingsville Symphony Orchestra was the first orchestra in South Texas to partner with Carnegie Hall in New York City to host the outreach program Link Up. Students of the KSO actively go out into the schools to teach the Link Up curriculum to area grade school students. The KSO performs a free children's concert each year to further music education in the Kingsville and surrounding communities.

### ■ Javelina String Choir

The Javelina String Choir is a group open to majors and non-majors who enjoy playing string chamber music. The Javelina String Choir goes on tour each year and performs a wide variety of music from baroque to pop. Javelina String Choir often plays at small events such as weddings and banquet venues.

## Awards and Accomplishments

The TAMUK Trumpet Studio has earned national acclaim for its outstanding performances. These exceptional musicians have taken the stage at events such as the International Trumpet Guild Conference, the College Music Society National Conference, and Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA) convention. In 2020, they had the honor of being invited to perform at the opening session of TMEA's 100th Anniversary as part of *It Starts with Music*.

Consistently competing at the highest levels, the studio's trumpet ensemble placed 3rd at the National Trumpet Competition (NTC) in 2021 and has advanced multiple soloists and groups to the semifinals across undergraduate solo, graduate solo, jazz solo, and ensemble divisions. In 2024, they had the honor to serve as the host institution for NTC.

In addition to competitions and showcases, in 2022, the studio released its debut ensemble album, *Out of the Blue*. This album is a collection of jazz trumpet ensemble works, including three original compositions written for the studio. It earned a bronze medal at the Global Music Awards.

## Performance Opportunities

### Trumpet Ensemble

The trumpet ensemble offers opportunities for small ensembles and the full trumpet choir. Repertoire ranges over the past 500 years of music. Students frequently compose and arrange music for the group, lead rehearsals, and conduct works on the studio concert each semester.

### Jazz Trumpet Ensemble

The Jazz Trumpets are a hybrid of the jazz and trumpet ensemble programs, specializing in repertoire typically for 4-5 trumpets, with or without rhythm section.

TAMUK also offers many ensemble opportunities for trumpet students, including four concert bands, three jazz big bands, three jazz combos, a Latin Jazz ensemble, the Kingsville Symphony Orchestra, Mariachi Javelina, and the Javelina Marching Band.

Through the years, the ensemble has not only grown in size, but also in reputation. Most notably, four members were winners of the 2014 International Quartet Competition at the IHS Symposium in London England and again in 2019 at the IHS Symposium in Ghent Belgium.
