Completion of 60 hours; ENGL 1301, ENGL 1302, MATH 1314, HIST 1301, and HIST 1302 with a "C" or better in ENGL 1302; Cumulative GPA of 2.75; College readiness based on TSI completion or exemption; passing score on Nelson Denny Reading Exam; 50% or higher score on diagnostic assessment in certification content area.
- Student must apply and be admitted into the EPP to enroll in any 3000-4000 level EDBL, EDED, EDRG and EDSE courses.
- Student must earn a "C" or higher required in all EDBL, EDED, EDKN, EDRG and EDSE courses and maintain in 2.75 GPA to remain in the EPP
- Students who do not meet EPP admission should see advisor to discuss options in continuing EDID degree or switching major to a non-certification degree program
- Graduation Requirements: A minimum of 36 hours of upper-division course work is required, Twenty-five percent of the total hours required must have been taken at TAMU-K. (24 hrs of the last 30 hrs must be taken at TAMU-K), Must complete a writing intensive course and earn a C or better in the course.
- Student must take and pass the TEXES content area exam <u>and</u> TEXES Pedagogy & Professional Responsibilities EC-12 exam prior to enrolling in EDED 4613/4623, Student Teaching.
 - o If EDED 4613/4623 is planned for spring semester the deadline to submit passing test scores is October 15th (the semester prior)
 - o If EDED 4613/4623 is planned for fall semester the deadline to submit passing test scores is April 15th (the semester prior)
