With a Master's of Science in Education Degree, a certified teacher is qualified to teach dual enrollment courses at the high school level. This online degree allows the graduate to teach pedagogy or content courses in a community college or university and provides an opportunity to pursue a doctoral degree in education or specific content.

HOW TO APPLY

Admission to the program is open to anyone who meets entrance requirements, regardless of ethnic background or national origin. Enrollment limitations are based exclusively on the availability of faculty and resources. In making admission decisions, the doctoral faculty engages in a comprehensive, systematic review of the applicant's academic proficiency and potential. Items examined in the review include but are not limited to, the following:

- Undergraduate transcripts
- GRE or MAT
- GPA minimum of 2.6 on last 60 hours of undergraduate work
