



Statement of Selective Service

As per Texas Education Code, [51.9095](#), a male student cannot receive a grant, scholarship, loan or other financial assistance funded by state revenue, unless a statement of the individual's selective service status is completed with the institution.

* - To be eligible for State student aid, male citizens and male immigrants residing in the U.S. aged 18 through 25 are required to register with the Selective Service System, with limited exceptions. The Selective Service System and the registration requirement applies to any person assigned the sex of male at birth (see [Selective Service System](#)).



Not Registered

If the student applying for financial aid indicates he has not reached age 18, he is not required to register. By law, he is required to register with the Selective Service within 30 days of his 18th birthday. He can also pre-register online at www.sss.gov if he is at least 17 years and 3 months old. In that case, he will be automatically registered when he reaches 18 years old.

Exemptions

- Females;
- Men who entered the United State of America after the age of 26;
- Non-immigrants on student, visitor, tourist, or diplomatic visas;
- Men on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces;
- Cadets and midshipmen in the Service Academies and certain other U.S. military colleges.
