Alicia Arredondo Clarke received the Tejano Service Award. Clarke has more than 60 years of service to South Texas education as an educator and school administrator.

Antonia Alvarez received the Tejano Service Award as well. Alvarez recently retired from Texas A&M University-Kingsville after serving there more than 30 years.

Oscar Gonzalez received the Tejano Heritage Award. Gonzalez was one of Javelina Nation's first Hispanic football players. Later, Gonzalez served as a teacher and coach in South Texas, and was also a County Commissioner for Jim Hogg County.
