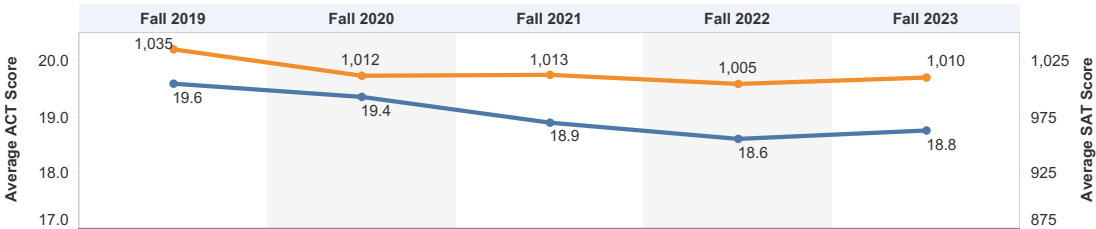

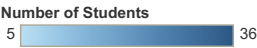

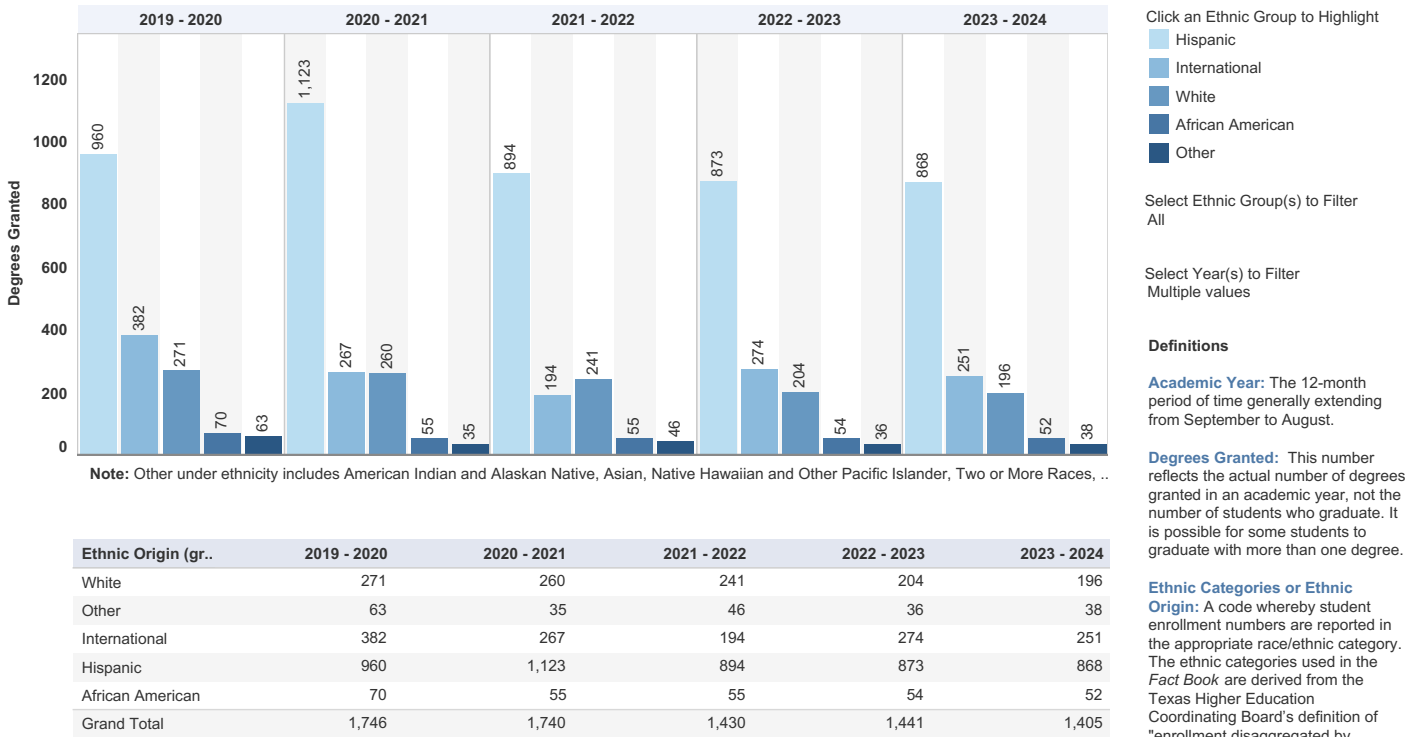

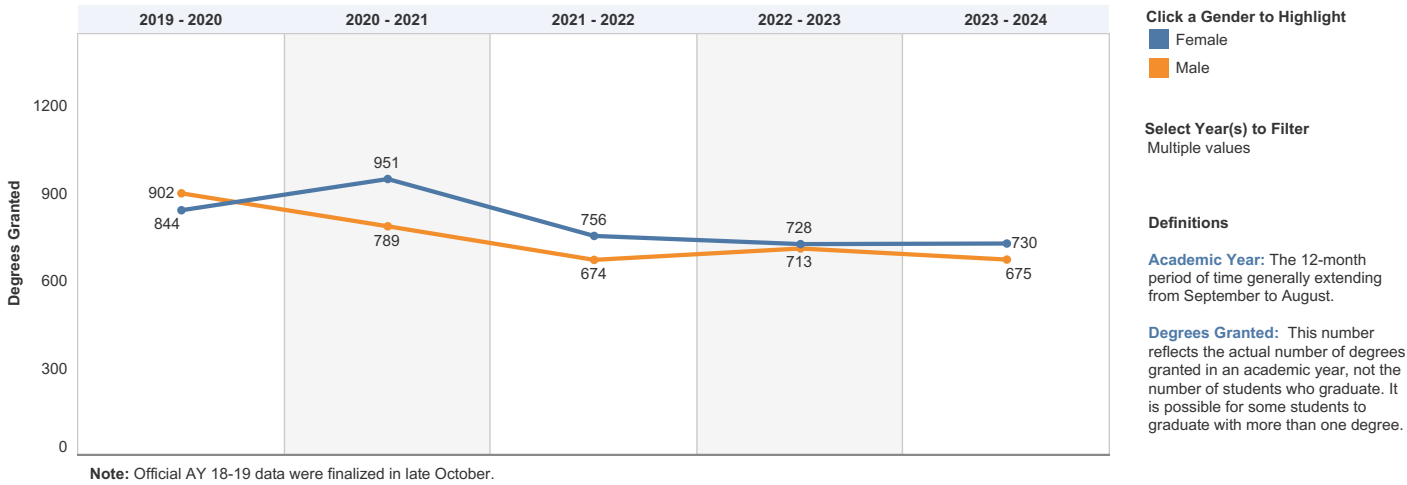

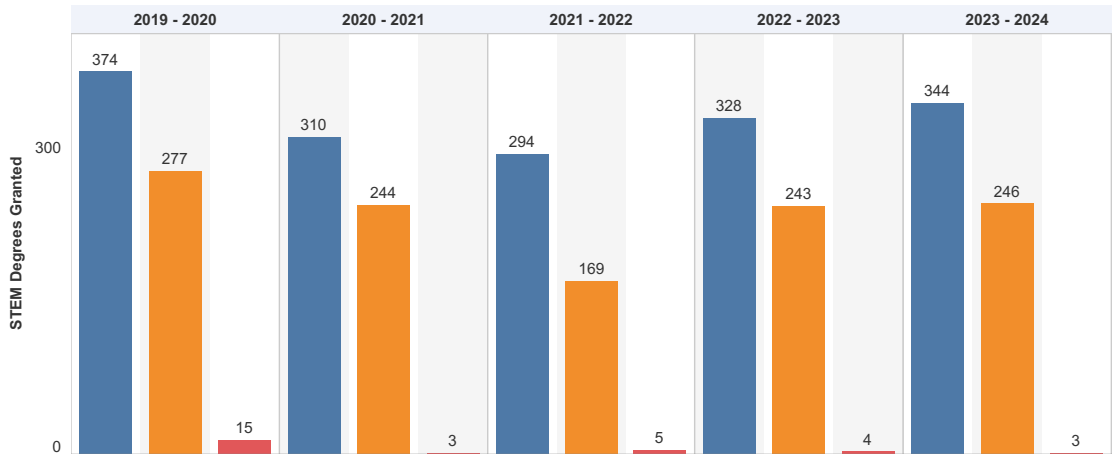

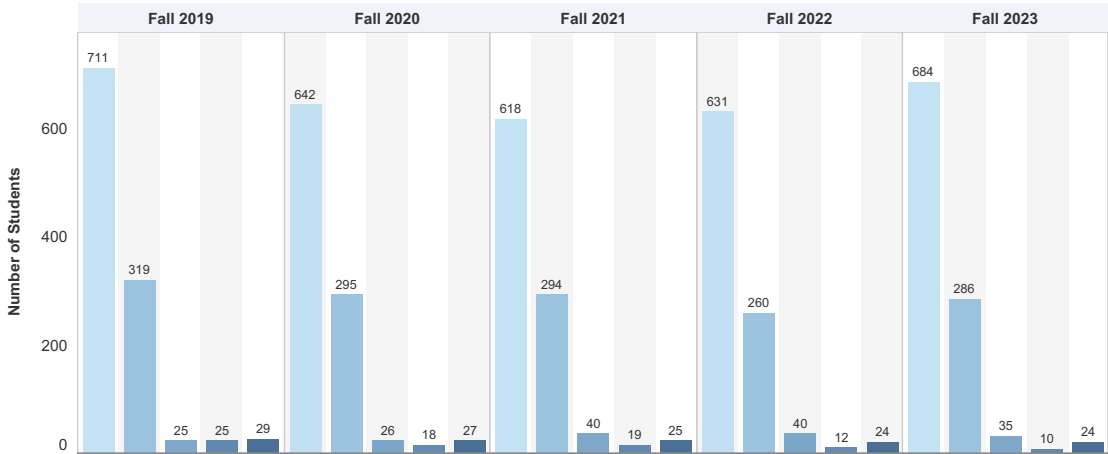

Definitions

Ethnic Categories or Ethnic Origin: A code whereby student enrollment numbers are reported in the appropriate race/ethnic category. The ethnic categories used in the *Fact Book* are derived from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's definition of "enrollment disaggregated by ethnicity" as found in the online institutional resumes for all Texas public universities. In order to make longitudinal comparisons, "Hispanic" students, except international ones, are counted as Hispanic. Students who are "Multi-racial" and claim African American as one ethnic category are included with the African American students. "Asian" includes Asian and Pacific Islanders. International Students are shown as a separate category.

Note: For the purposes of this FactBook, "Other" under ethnicity includes American Indian and Alaskan Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, Two or More Races, and Unknown Race and Ethnicity...

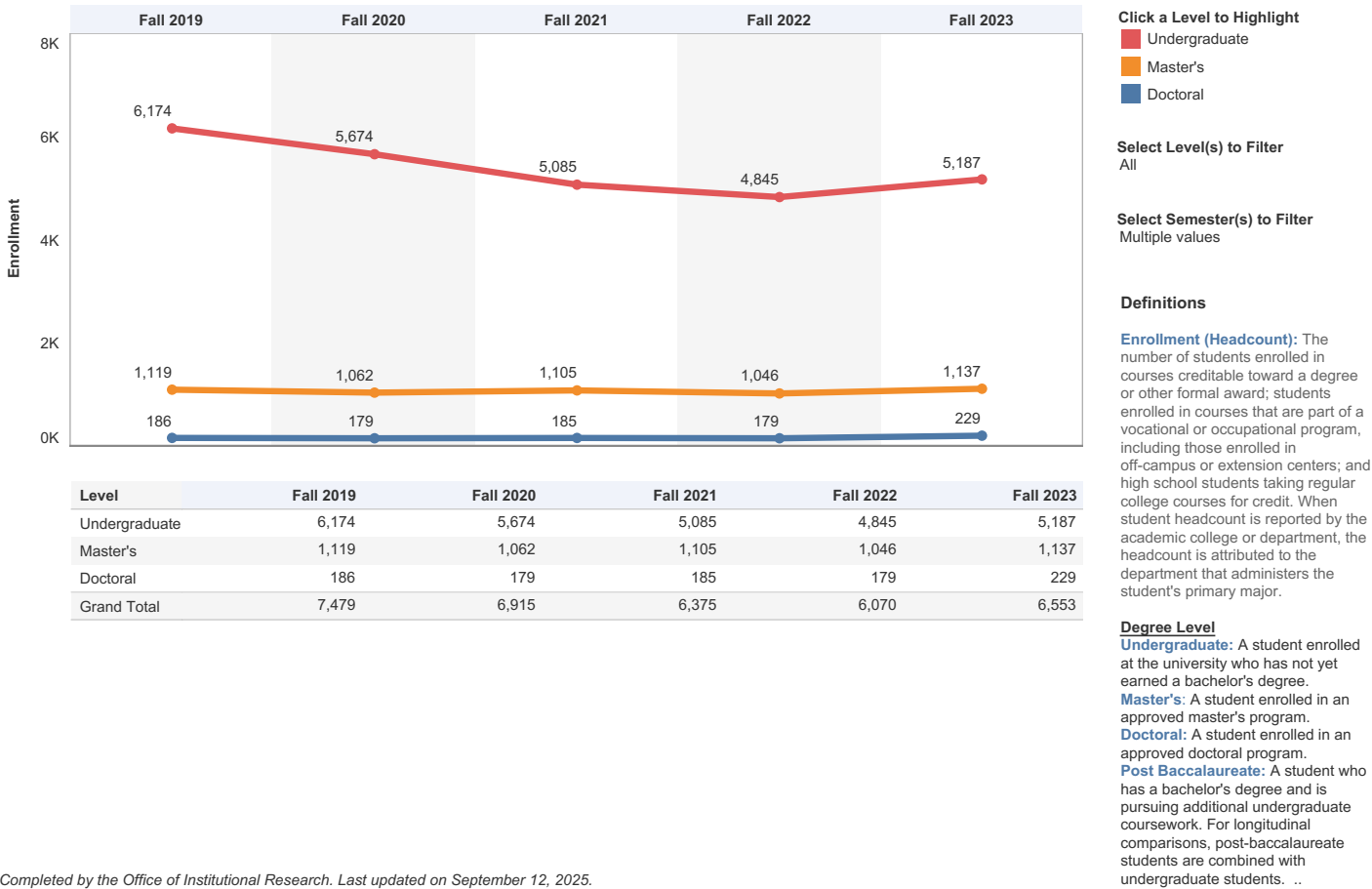

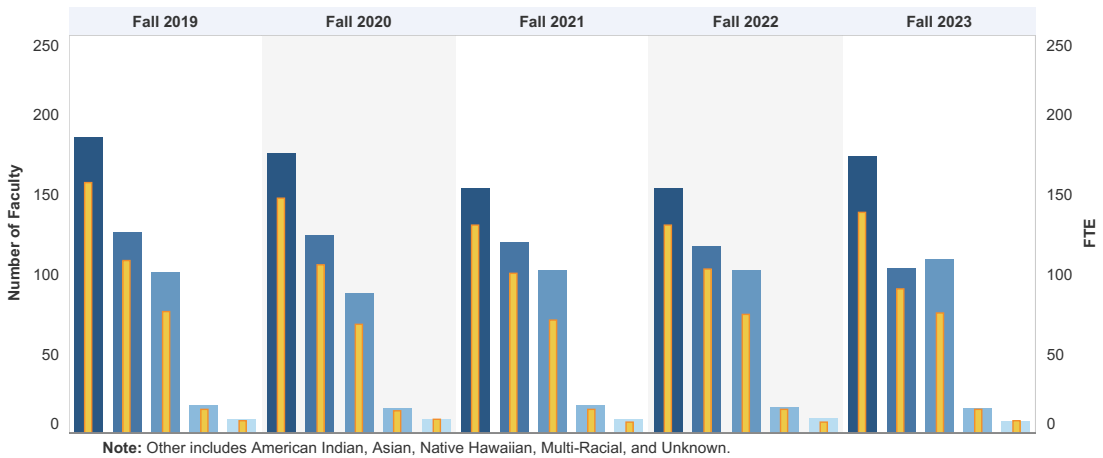

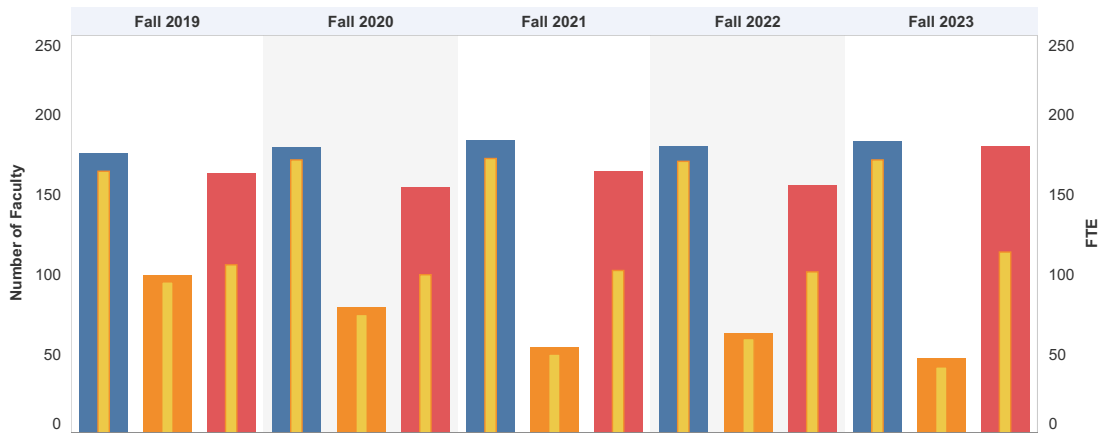

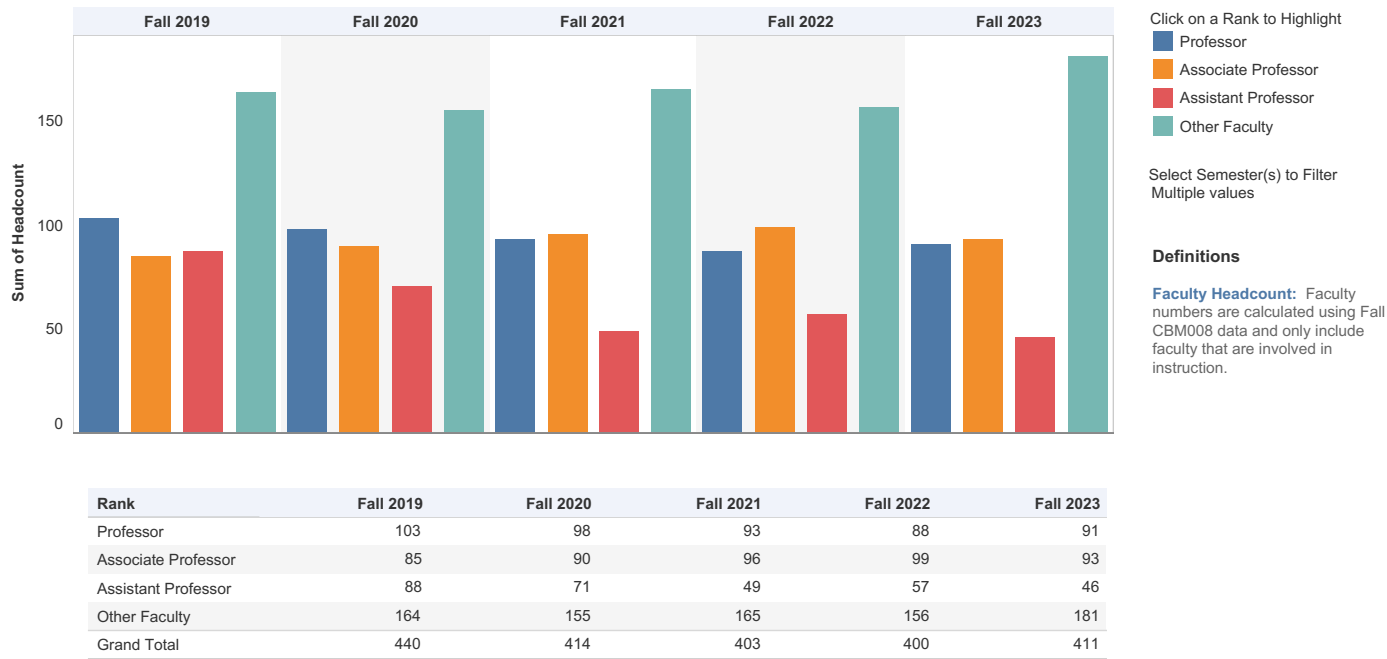

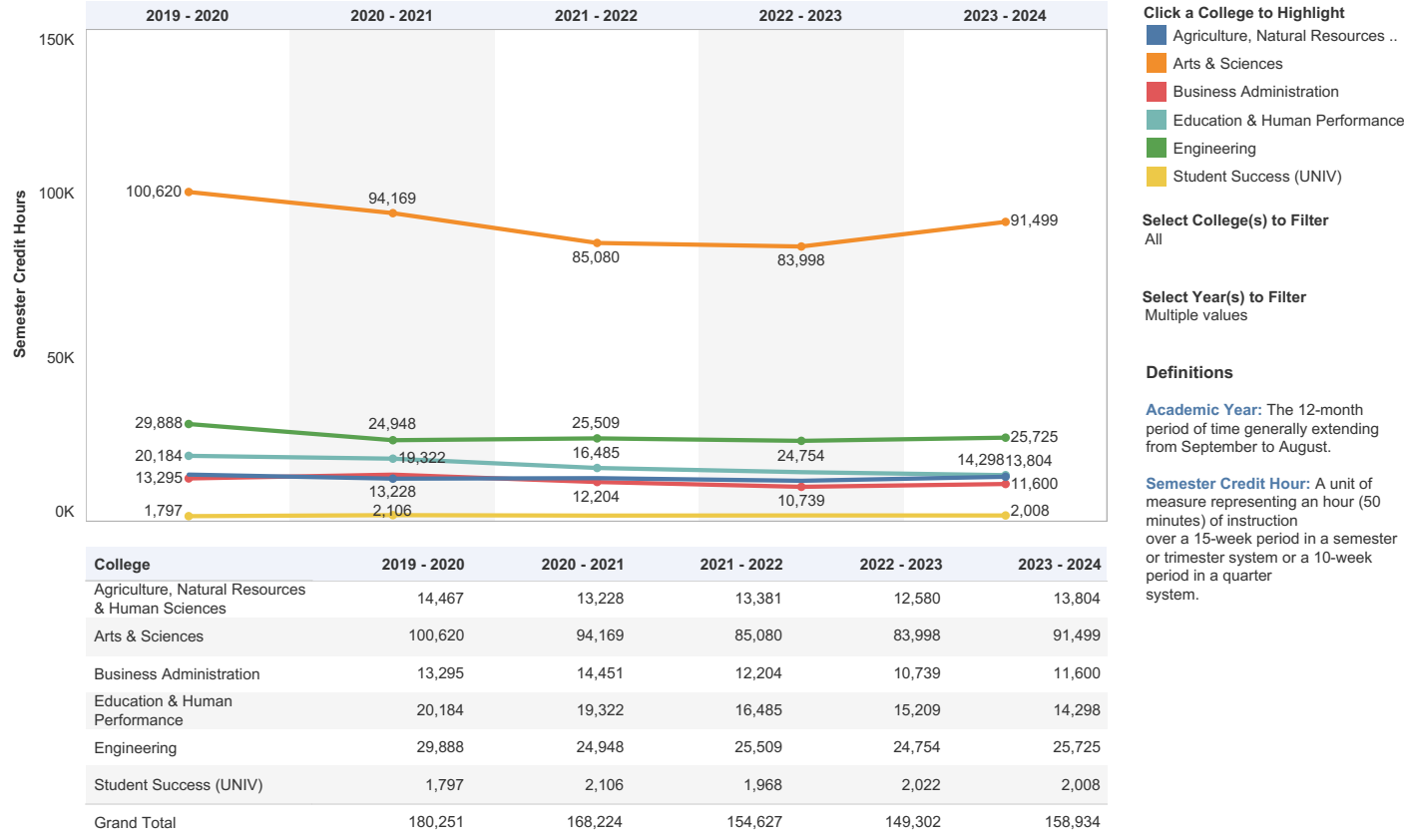

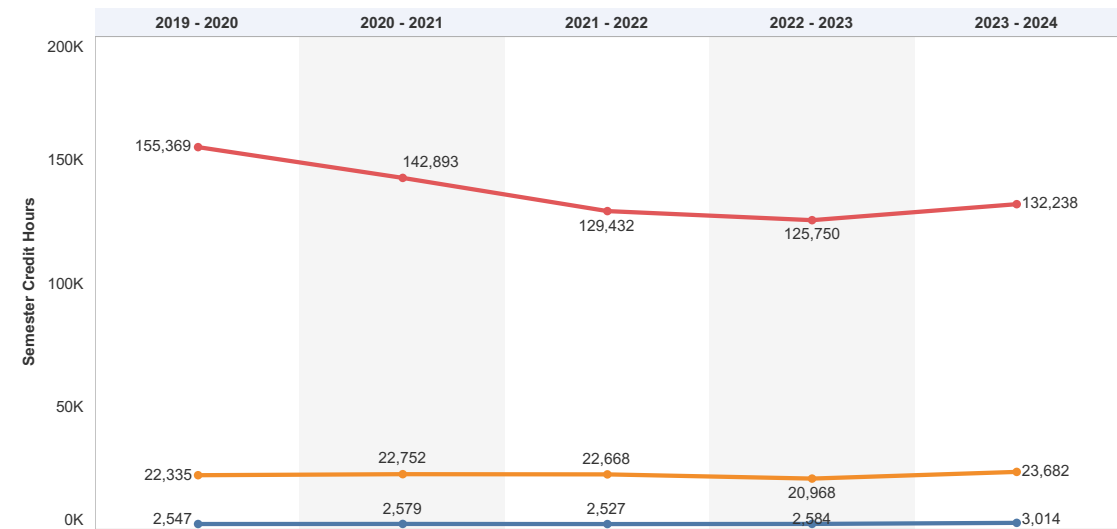

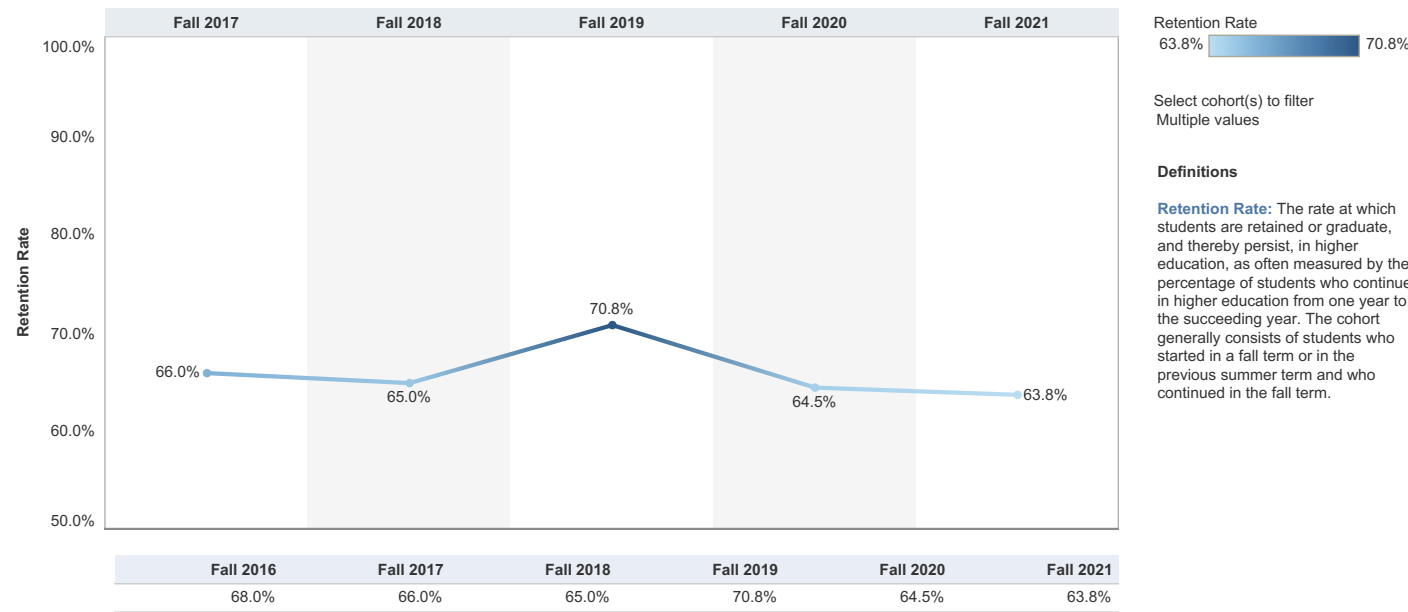

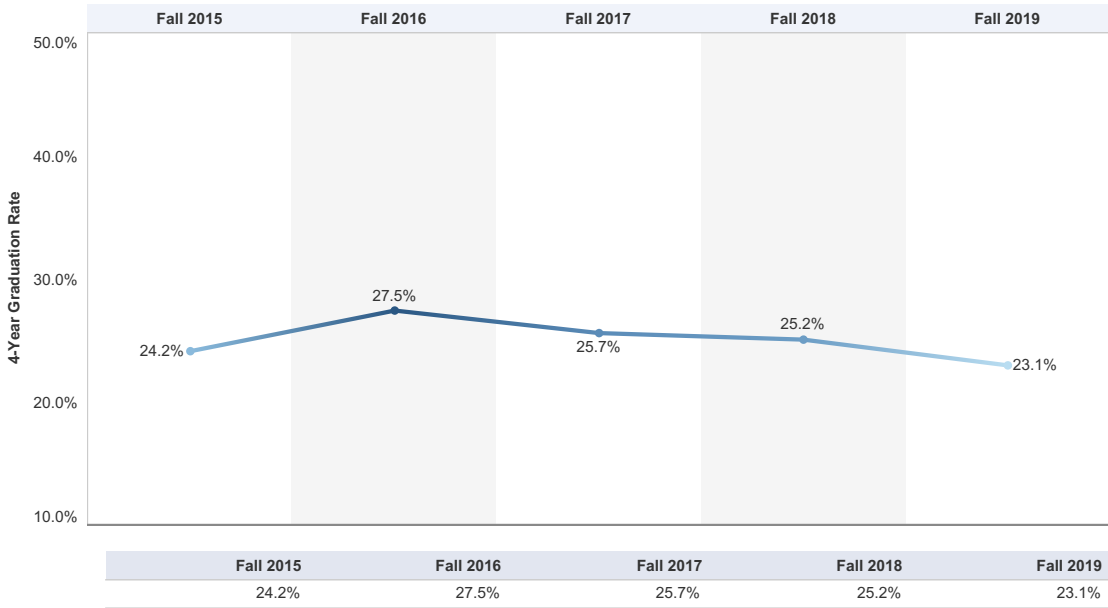
