

WHAT IS SIL?

Supervised Independent Living (SIL) is a voluntary Extended Foster Care placement where young adults can live on their own, while still getting casework and support services to help them become independent and self-sufficient. The Department of Family and Protective Services has partnered with Texas A&M University System, specifically Texas A&M University-Kingsville, to provide a SIL program within the campus residence halls.



HOW CAN SIL HELP ME?
